SECOND READING

You will not be expecting us to write anything to you, brothers, about 'times and seasons', since you know very well that the Day of the Lord is going to come like a thief in the night. It is when people are saving, 'How guiet and peaceful it is' that the worst suddenly happens, as suddenly as labour pains come on a pregnant woman; and there will be no way for anybody to evade it. But it is not as if you live in the dark, my brothers, for that Day to overtake you like a thief. No, you are all sons of light and sons of the day: we do not belong to the night or to darkness, so we should not go on sleeping, as everyone else does, but stay wide awake and sober.

Next the man with the two talents came forward. "Sir," he said "you entrusted me with two talents; here are two more that I have made."

As Christopher Lamb in the Tablet has said that there will be a major shake-up in the Church, with women having more roles in ministry, an overhaul of seminary training, mandatory parish councils and lay involvement in decision making and a revision of Canon Law.
