Trinity Sunday

We come to the culmination of the drama of Salvation, we begun with the First Sunday of Advent. We start the Liturgical year looking the future, a time of joyful expectation, knowing that the hope and promises of God are to be fulfilled. Then from 17th December we focus on the events that took place before the first coming of Christ, not a joyful triumphant entre but lowly in stable. Then Christmas focuses on Incarnation, God taking flesh, and then the second theme of Epiphany. God who reveals divine life and love to us all. Lent we start the journey of with Christ that takes us to the drama of Maund Thursday and Good Friday, self-giving love and deep shadow of human nature are fiercely intertwined with each other, the emptiness of Holy Saturday announces that it is the inability of human nature to accept love that has had the final say, but when the empty space of the tomb is encountered there is a divine revelation that divine self-giving love has overcome all the destructive forces that have been faced. The encounter of the Risen Christ is transformative for broken humanity an empowering us through the gift of the Holy Spirit to continue the work of Christ, to proclaim to the whole world, the divine self-giving love, that may appear to be a candle in the wind is in fact the Light of the World the darkness cannot overpower. So having briefly outlined the story of our salvation we conclude this weekend that we have received the epiphany of God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit, an inter-communion of self-giving love that spills over into creation. We are created, so finite, vet with these limitations called to share in this divine life of the Trinity. This interweaving of divine life enables to share in the divine dance of Faith, Hope and Love. This is what has been manifested in our story of salvation and in the revelation of the unity and diversity of the very life of God.

Pope Francis on Prayer

Dear Brothers and Sisters, in our continuing catechesis on prayer, we now consider how our prayer leads us into the life of the Holy Trinity, into the eternal mystery of God's love, which is the source and joy of the entire universe. Jesus himself revealed this path for us by taking on our flesh and revealing the Father's infinite love. By his paschal mystery, he opened for us the gates of heaven and by the gift of the Holy Spirit he has given us a share in his own filial relationship to the Father. Conscious of our unworthiness of so great a gift, we, like the disciples, can cry out "Lord, teach us to pray" (Lk 11:1). Jesus teaches us not only the words to use in prayer, but shows us the boundless mercy of the Father, who embraces his prodigal children and goes freely in search of every lost sheep. May our prayer awaken in us the consciousness of our lofty vocation in Christ and draw us ever more fully into the loving communion of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.
