And Jesus said to them, 'A prophet is only despised in his own country, among his own relations and in his own house'; and he could work no miracle there, though he cured a few sick people by laying his hands on them. He was amazed at their lack of faith.

14th Sunday of the Year

As we hear the Gospel of Mark till the end of November, we need to keep in mind that at the moment we are in the first part, before St Peter proclaims that Jesus is the Christ. We know this important news but Mark is building up to this crescendo moment.

Throughout his ministry Mark is giving us clues in the word and actions of Jesus especially in his healing ministry, but many do not appreciate his true significance. Of the three roles of Priest, Prophet and King, that Jesus is seem as fulfilling in the Gospel today, it his prophetic role that he expressing. That is the call to witness to truth and hope by word and actions, but like Jesus, even those who are closest to us may not understand but we are called to faithful to our respective calling and visions of faith, hope and love. Prophets are called to speak the truth, even it is critical but also offer a vision of hope. So proclaiming truth and hope is a role we all have since our baptism calls us to share in the prophetic role of Jesus. But we are also called to be attentive and listening to others as well. That is the heart of the synod process. We need to understand and appreciate others. So, prophets as well as speaking must be attentive as well in discerning God's presence and will.

Pope Francis on Prayer

Dear Brothers and Sisters: In our continuing catechesis on prayer, we now consider the prayer of Abraham. In the life of our "father in faith", we see a new way of relating to God. Abraham hears the voice of God and trusts in his word and promises. In obedience to the divine word, he leaves his former life behind to journey wherever God leads him, even to the ultimate test of being asked to sacrifice his own son, Isaac. Through such fidelity, he becomes a member of God's family, capable even of arguing with him, but always faithful. Abraham's obedience to the word marks a radically new step in the religious development of man. From now on, the life of believers is seen in terms of vocation, a personal call to live one's life in fulfilment of God's promises. The God of Abraham, then, becomes "my God", the Lord of my own history who guides my steps and never abandons me. May we learn from Abraham's example how to pray with faith: to listen, to journey, to converse and even welcome the word and put it into practice.

Meeting with Alan Campbell

At the meeting we had powerful testimonies from the mothers of young children living in poor housing, the children of St Cuthbert's sharing the plight of refugees, hearing about the hardship of low paid care workers from one of our parishioners. We also heard from two pupils about how having a school counsellor has been important for their well-being and education. Sir Alan was clearly loved by what he heard and sought to take action on the issues raised. What was highly significant was the pledge he made if his part formed the next Government on the ask of St Thomas More Pupils, that every school in the nation would have a school based mental health counsellor at the cost of £250 million. This is a great success for the school's campaign. For Type and Wear Citizens to achieve such a commitment of over billion pounds in the next parliamentary terms is the biggest win we have obtained as an alliance and an extraordinary achievement for St Thomas More School. Well done!
